

### How to Tell the Age of Your Barramundi

You can determine the age of barramundi by counting growth rings on their scales or their earbones (otoliths) much like counting the growth rings found on a tree. There are many factors that can affect the growth of a fish.

For example, fish from an early spawning have a head start on those fish that are spawned late and will generally be larger by the end of their first year. Food availability and water conditions also affect the rate of growth.

Examples of length to age: one year old barra are between 30-40 cm long, two years old are 50-60 cm long, three year old are 60-80 cm and 100 cm barra are around eight years old.
